Since 1997, the graduating classes of the Law School have maintained a tradition of raising funds for a class gift. This year, the Class of 2004 came together to build on this tradition by organizing the first-ever class pledge campaign. The Continuing the Community Class of 2004 Pledge Campaign was an incredible success, exceeding all expectations by raising nearly \$40,000 in five-year pledges from 30% of the class.

An enthusiastic and creative committee of third-year students solicited their classmates, emphasizing the importance of joining the community of Law School alumni whose giving vastly enriches the quality of education and co-curricular opportunities available at the school. Committee member Ashley Tatman, who achieved 100% participation from the classmates on her list, was delighted to be a part of the program: AI was involved with the Class of 2004 Pledge program because I feel that I owe a lot to IU Law. I was given a scholarship when I started law school and it was a very important part of why I chose IU. My three years here were fabulous and I am proud to be a graduate of such a terrific school. The costs of providing scholarships and extracurricular activities and even hiring great professors cannot be met by state funding and tuition combined.
