This panel explores revisionist scholarship on antebellum constitutional politics. Traditional wisdom, best articulated by Charles Warren and Robert McCloskey, regards this era as a golden age, marked by a sharp separation between law and politics. The participants on this panel disagree. American politics was saturated with constitutional concerns. The primary motor driving American constitutional development before the Civil War was politics out of doors, exhibited for example in popular responses to the Alien and Sedition Acts and the use of militia as a form of constitutional protest. American constitutional law was saturated with politics. Court appointments were made with

political ends in mind, most justices had previously been prominent politicians, and such constitutional struggles as Cherokee removal can only be understood at the intersection of law and politics.
