

**WELCOME FOR THE 2005 AALS WORKSHOP  
ON CLINICAL LEGAL EDUCATION –  
CLINICAL TEACHING AND SUPERVISION:  
A PARTICIPATORY WORKSHOP**

As clinicians we face the challenge of creating for our students a synthesis of doing and learning. We do this by offering them the experience of acting as lawyers in real-life situations, under supervision, and supported by classroom instruction. Enabling our students both to *do* and to *learn* from doing poses complex pedagogical issues for us as clinic teachers.

What should our students learn from doing? How can we, as their teachers and supervisors, ensure that students learn what they should through supervised professional work for the benefit of others? How can we also ensure that our students perform excellent legal work while at the same time affording them the maximum degree of professional responsibility for that work? What is the right balance between teaching *through* doing and teaching *about* doing? What are the skills, values, attitudes, and sensitivities that we want our students to bring to their professional efforts on behalf of others? What are the most effective ways of teaching those skills, values, attitudes, and sensitivities?

These are some of the issues that we will explore in the working groups that are the heart of this year's clinical workshop. The Planning Committee has attempted to organize the working groups around areas of practice, so that, for example, criminal justice clinicians will be together in a specialty working group where they will have a common base from which to explore pedagogical and professional issues. Similarly, clinicians whose students do not provide direct service to clients, but rather work with partner organizations or engage in legislative advocacy will be able to examine the challenges of teaching and supervising "indirect" advocacy on behalf of "client" populations. And finally, externship clinicians will have the choice of joining either an all-externship working group, or a working group in the substantive practice area of their externship program.

We have asked each of you to bring to your working group discussions examples of your own teaching and supervision to share with your fellow group members. What have you found to be particularly effective (or ineffective) in teaching professional competencies, and in raising issues of professional values and

social justice? What successes – and what challenges – have you experienced in your teaching and supervision that you can offer your fellow group members for discussion? What “teachable moments” have captured – or escaped – your attention as a teacher or supervisor, and how did, or should you have, dealt with them? What curricular innovations have you tried, or writing have you done, that might be helpful to other clinicians?

It is our hope that the working group discussions, supported by the plenary sessions, will be both useful and inspiring to the clinicians gathering for this year’s Workshop on Clinical Legal Education, just as it is our confident expectation that being together, in the company of old and new friends, will renew our energy and dedication to our common mission as clinical teachers.
