
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#### Title II Farm Bill

#### What's in the farm bill? (Costs from FY2014-2023)



### Key programs: EQIP & CSP

- O Largest programs under title II
- O Environmental Quality Incentives Program
- O Conservation Stewardship Program
- O Both require conservation plans
- O Producer "contracts" ranked in order of conservation

### Environmental Quality Incentives Program

O\$1.35 billion FY14

O\$1.6 billion FY15

O\$1.65 billion FY16-FY17

O\$1.75 billion FY18

### What practices receive cost share?

- O Differs by state. Fencing, watering facilities, pasture and hayland planting, for example
- O For CAFOs: comprehensive nutrient management plan, storage, treatment and utilization of animal waste



# Conservation Stewardship Program

- O Funding limits set as an acre cap = 10 million acres
- O Payments for good stewardship practices already in place and for two additional conservation enhancements

## What practices receive cost share?

O Practices can be "bundled"



### Wisconsin dairy farm example

- O Installing barnyard sediment basin and waste storage
- O Cover crops
- O Nutrient management
