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Markets." We have an exciting group of scholars addressing that topic from unique angles – <u>Professor Maureen</u> (Molly) E. Brady (University of Virginia School of Law); <u>Professor Shelley Cavalieri</u> (University of Toledo College of Law); <u>Professor Cori Harvey</u> (Florida A&M University College of Law); <u>Professor Rashmi Dyal-Chand</u> (Northeastern University School of Law); and <u>Professor Joseph William Singer</u> (Harvard Law School).

Thank you to all who participated in the call for papers – we had an amazing response, with nearly a dozen outstanding papers submitted and reviewed. It was an almost impossible choice for the Executive Committee, because we unanimously wished we could have heard from every scholar who submitted on the topic.

I especially hope you will stay through Saturday. January 6, from 3:30 pm -5:15 pm, for what might be the most important thing we do at the annual meeting—our forum for junior scholars to present their work. For the "New Voices in Property Law: Junior Scholars Works-in-Progress Panel," our executive committee selected eight

papers from our call for submissions. Each of the eight junior scholars have been matched with two official commenters who will read their paper in advance. Thank you to all of the commenters who have agreed to provide formal feedback!

At the session, each junior scholar will have 2-3 minutes to give an "elevator pitch" summary of their paper and project to the full gathering of attendees. We will then break into separate round tables for discussions with each junior scholar for the remaining hour. Finally, I wanted to provide a brief report on a very successful event in Fall 2017. The AALS Property Section co-sponsored—with Penn State Law (University Park) and the AALS Commercial and Related Consumer Law Section—a "Property Implications of the Sharing Economy Workshop" on October 6-7, 2017.
