The AALS Section on National Security Law is pleased to announce an Early Works in National Security Law Workshop to be held on Friday, April 26, 2024 via zoom.

One of the Section's objectives is to broaden the reach of the Section to welcome and support new members, particularly from groups that have been historically underrepresented in the field of national security law. This objective is reflected in a series of programs to be held during the year leading up to the Annual Meeting, including this early works-in-progress workshop for emerging and established scholars in the fields of national security law and related disciplines. We are excited to offer this program which is designed to provide an informal structure and the opportunity for constructive and supportive feedback on projects in the early iteration and origination stages.

All participants are expected to read all submissions which will be circulated two weeks prior to the event. Submission discussions will be individually led by members of the Section who will serve as discussants. The program will be held via zoom to allow for maximum participation.

<u>Eligibility</u>: This call for early works is open to full-time faculty members from AALS member schools, whether tenured or untenured and regardless of the number of years the individual has been teaching. The Section welcomes both single-authored and co-authored submissions.

<u>Author Submissions + Registration</u>: All national security law-related law topics are welcome, and both emerging and established scholars are strongly encouraged to submit. Submissions (in the form of an abstract no more than 750-words) are due by March 22, 2024 via this form. Papers will be selected after review by a committee appointed by the Section Chair. Selected authors will be notified by April 5, 2024, and submission will be circulated to all participants by April 12. There is no registration fee.
