Angel Diaz is an Associate Professor of Law at LMU Loyola Law School. He writes and teaches in the areas of private law, critical race theory, and law and technology. His scholarship examines how private law interacts with public regulation to shape access to public space and privatize inequality. His work has been published or is forthcoming in the UCLA Law Review and the Boston University Law Review.

Diaz received his JD and BA from UC Berkeley. He was previously a Visiting Assistant Professor at USC Gould School of Law and a Lecturer at UCLA Law. Before academia, he was Counsel to the Liberty and National Security program at the Brennan Center for Justice, and practiced corporate law in New York City.
