Implications of Integrated v. Dual Supervision

What Integrated Supervision Typically Does Better than Dual Supervision

- 1. Provides intensive supervision and scaffolding for student work
- 2. Holistically integrates theory, doctrine, fieldwork, feedback, and reflection from a single supervisor
- 3. Provides immediate or near-in-time guidance and feedback on multiple performances based on direct knowledge of matter and/or direct observation of student's actions by the teacher
- 4. Fosters collaborative learning with cohort of peers
- 5. Fosters detached critique of practice norms

What Dual Supervision Typically Does Better Than Integrated Supervision

- 1. Permits two perspectives on actual work performed by student
- 2. Permits two perspectives on integration of theory, doctrine, and practice
- 3. Fosters student self-reliance and independence, because field supervisor's primary obligation is to mission of placement organization
