

**Junior Scholars' Program Call for Papers and Commentators**

***New Voices in Property Law: Junior Scholars Works-in-Progress Panel***  
**AALS Annual Meeting 2022**

The Section on Property Law is pleased to announce a Call for Papers from which three junior faculty members will be selected to present at the Section's "***New Voices in Property Law: Junior Scholars Works-in-Progress Panel***" to be held on Saturday, January 8<sup>th</sup> at 4:45 – 6:00 pm ET, during the AALS 2022 Annual Meeting, which will be held virtually. In the past we have had more than three presentations, but the AALS is limiting us this year to three presenters and three respondents.

The purpose of this works-in-progress program is to bring together junior (pre-tenure or teaching for seven or fewer years) and senior property law scholars to give the junior scholars an opportunity to present and get useful feedback on papers *that will not yet have been submitted for publication as of January 2022*. (Posting the draft paper on SSRN or the like is fine.)

In addition to having the opportunity to share work through the panel, at least one senior scholar will be designated as a reviewer who will have read the paper ahead of time and will be prepared to discuss the paper and offer constructive comments at the session and/or in writing.

**Form and length of submission:**

***Please submit a 300 – 400 word abstract in Word to the Professor Shelley Cavalieri at [shelley.cavalieri@utoledo.edu](mailto:shelley.cavalieri@utoledo.edu) with "Submission: Property New Voices" in the subject line. Submissions must be received by September 1, 2020.***

The AALS Annual Meeting will be entirely virtual in 2022. Call for Papers presenters will be responsible for paying registering for the meeting, but the AALS is offering school-wide registration.

**Submission review:**

Papers will be selected after review by members of the Executive Committee of the Property Section.
