## Immediate Predicaments

### **Health Pandemics**

Shutdowns of law offices

Need for immediate changes in classroom and experiential education

Rapidly spreading illness among practitioners, academics, students

Different health restrictions in different jurisdictions

Lessened ability to schedule/meet in alternative manners

### **Political Crises**

- Immediate effect on ability to keep offices open and meet safely – whether locally or globally
- Urgent need to deal with issues of life and death, disease, human rights
- Difficulty in communication within and outside of affected areas
- Closed and highly restricted borders

## Immediate Needs

- Immediate consultation among affected groups/individuals
- Legal advice re interruption of services
- Accelerated development of communication tools
- Development of "work-arounds" for meeting/studying abroad
  - Adapting to travel restrictions
  - Addressing need to plan for continued disruption and unforeseen developments

Immediate Solutions -Connecting during Crises

- Determine any limitations on communication and solve them
- Stay connected share creative solutions
- Develop and enhance electronic communications
- Brainstorm solutions with colleagues/groups
- Host guest speakers remotely


